

THE SCHOOL

Kirby School is an independent, co-educational day school for grades 6 through 12 and is a member of, and accredited by, the California Association of Independent Schools, the National Association of Independent Schools, and the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. Kirby's CEEB Code is 053290. Established in 1994, Kirby was named for Santa Cruz pioneer Georgiana Bruce Kirby, who devoted her life to education, freedom, and enfranchisement. The School was founded on the belief that students who are respected and encouraged will exhibit great enthusiasm for learning and achieve at the highest levels.

FACULTY

69 percent of Kirby's 32 faculty members hold advanced degrees, including 4 Doctorates and 18 Master's Degrees. Fine and performing arts teachers have augmented their formal degrees with extensive professional experience.

STUDENTS

Kirby's current enrollment is 171 students: 60 in the middle school (6-8) and 111 in the high school (9-12). The graduating Class of 2022 had 35 students. Kirby's average class size is 12. The school admits students on their ability to be successful in a rigorous academic environment without regard to race, color, creed, gender, sexual orientation, religion, physical disability, national origin or other legally protected status.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Kirby's commitment to tuition assistance is designed to support a highly qualified and diverse student body, and is a fundamental part of the school's mission. For the 2022-2023 academic year, 34% of Kirby's students received tuition assistance, totaling \$1,600,000.

INTENSIVE ACADEMIC PATHS

In addition to Honors and AP courses, Kirby offers four elective high school Intensive Paths for students wishing to pursue in-depth study in a specific academic or artistic field. All paths meet or exceed the 94-unit graduation requirement.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY INTENSIVE PATH (STIP)

STIP provides a program for students interested in intensive study of science, math, and/or computer sciences, with the goal of reaching a high level of mastery and positioning themselves for advanced college-level work. STIP students' coursework includes four years of laboratory science, four years of mathematics (including Pre-calculus), a research project or internship, and additional elective units in science, math, and computer science.

HUMANITIES INTENSIVE PATH (HIP)

HIP enables students who are passionate about history, writing, and/or literature to explore those areas in depth. HIP coursework includes five years of history or English and culminates in a focused senior project advised by a faculty mentor.

LANGUAGES INTENSIVE PATH (LIP)

LIP offers students intensive study of foreign languages and cultures. LIP students use their elective options for focused study in world cultures, including four years of one foreign language and two additional years in a second language.

ARTS INTENSIVE PATH (AIP)

AIP emphasizes the study of fine or performing arts. Under the mentorship of a faculty advisor, AIP students choose a general arts program or concentrated study in a specific discipline, supported by a total of 18 additional units in the arts and a creative, culminating project presented in the senior year.

GRADING AND CLASS RANK

Grade point average (GPA) is calculated using all courses. In high school, final GPAs are cumulative from the fall semester of freshman year. For transfer students, all courses from the previous school are used (except when transferring from an International School). Advanced Placement, Honors, and University of California transferable college-level courses are weighted. Class Rank: Students are not ranked.



- ♦ We offer an individualized college counseling program for every student
- ♦ Families receive information about planning for college beginning in 9th grade but every student can take advantage of these services
- ♦ 11th and 12th graders meet regularly with our college counselor for planning and social-emotional support
- Rising seniors are invited to college essay writing and college application workshops each summer
- ♦ Each year, representatives from approximately 40 colleges and universities visit our campus both in-person and remotely to engage with students

Application Checklist

We are excited that you are considering Kirby! This checklist will walk you through the entire online admissions application process:

Access the Kirby Portal at kirby.myschoolapp.com. This is where you will find everything you need to proceed with the online admissions application. Kirby will create your username, and you will initiate this being sent to you when you first access the Kirby Portal. You will be prompted to set up your own password to access the portal. Be sure to put kirby@myschoolapp.com on your "safe senders" email list in order to receive email notifications.

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The Initial Application:

 □ Provide general student and family information □ Upload a student photo □ Submit the application fee via the portal
The Parent Statement: You may complete this directly in the portal. It is located under the checklist section the Admissions Progress page. Click the "Fill Out" button next to this step in the Parent Statement area of you checklist in the portal.
The Student Statement: Copy included in this packet. You may also download and print this form in the Kirby Portal. This must be handwritten by the student. Once completed, scan the statement, and upload it into the portal in the Student Statement area of your checklist. Alternatively, you may photograph and send a copy of the completed statement to the Admissions Office via email, and we will upload it to the Kirby Portal for you.
Request Teacher Recommendations from the current school: You may send recommendation requests to teachers directly in the Kirby portal, via email. Recommendations should come from your student's most recent teachers.

Submit Academic Records: Please submit your student's academic records for the last two school years.
Complete the <u>Academic Records Request</u> form, available for download in the Kirby Portal in your checklist. Give the completed request form to your student's school to give them permission to release transcripts to us. If your student has an IEP/504 plan/ psychoeducational testing report, please include those along with the academic records.
Interview and Writing Assessment: Once <u>all</u> of the above documents have been received, we will contact you
set un an interview and writing assessment for your student. Please allow approximately one hour for

Admissions Decision Notification: You will be notified of the acceptance decision as soon as your student's application has been reviewed by our Admissions Committee. Decisions are typically communicated within one to two weeks of the student interview date.

Admissions Calendar

Important dates to remember when considering Kirby...

December 1, 2022 - The Tuition Assistance Application opens online for those who wish to explore this option. To ensure objectivity, Kirby uses an outside service, Financial Aid for School Tuition (FAST) to evaluate applications. Remember that you will need to have your completed tax returns for the 2022 tax year to complete the Tuition Assistance application.
February 7, 2023 - Priority Admissions Application Deadline Priority consideration for a spot at Kirby is given to students who complete the Admissions Application by this date. Families applying for tuition assistance <i>must</i> have their Admissions Application submitted by this date (the Initial Application, Parent Statement and Student Statement completed, and teacher recommendation request sent).
February 16, 2023 – Tuition Assistance Application Deadline Tuition Assistance Applications must be submitted to FAST by this date. The Admissions Application is separate from the Tuition Assistance Application process.
If you apply to Kirby after February and wish to explore Tuition Assistance, contact Laura Lucas at llucas@kirby.org to determine if your family is still eligible to apply based upon the availability of funds.
We have a rolling admissions process. Students are welcome to apply to the school at any time for attending the following school year. We will accept applicants for a fall start date or a mid-year start date in January.
